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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Healthy Alaskans 2020

Healthy Alaskans 2020 is a statewide initiative with the goal of identifying 25 Leading Health Indicators, or measurements, to guide health efforts in Alaska for the remainder of the decade. The Healthy Alaskans 2020 (HA2020) initiative is a joint effort between the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services and the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium. The HA2020 process will consist of identifying a short list of Leading Health Indicators (LHIs), setting targets for improvement between now and 2020, and highlighting relevant evidence-based strategies to help reach those targets. The LHIs will guide efforts in our state around common health goals to improve health outcomes and attain health equity for all Alaskans. Through collaboration across sectors, the process is providing many opportunities to build trust and a foundation for shared responsibility and commitment to tackle identified health needs among partners and stakeholders. The HA2020 goals belong to all Alaskans, and success in reaching 25 health goals by 2020 depends on shared responsibility and commitment from communities, individual and organizations around the state.

The process of identifying LHIs involves gathering input related to health concerns and meaningful measures, or indicators, from a broad Community of Interest in addition to collecting and analyzing quantitative data related to a broad range of health factors. The CoI is a general term being used in the HA2020 initiative to refer to people in Alaska who are interested in sharing their thoughts and knowledge to help inform the HA2020 process. The surveys provide an opportunity to participate in the HA2020 process and provide input on health priorities and health indicators that are important to individuals in their communities. Input from the CoI was solicited using multiple forms of outreach, and efforts were coordinated by HA2020 team members. Outreach methods included, but were not limited to, press releases, advertisements, interviews, presentations, and social media.

The first survey, Community of Interest Survey One, was open to the public between September 17, 2012, and October 22, 2012. Survey One asked about general health priorities for individuals and their communities. Over 1,700 Alaskans responded to the first survey and the general health priorities of highest concern were: alcohol use; the cost of health care; and diet, exercise and obesity. The results from the first survey, Community of Interest Survey One Results, are available on the Healthy Alaskans 2020 website (*ha2020.alaska.gov*).

This report contains results from Community of Interest Survey Two, which was open for public input between January 14, 2013, and February 28, 2013. In addition to collecting more information on general health areas of concern for individuals and their communities, Survey Two was designed to identify specific health measures, or indicators, most meaningful to Alaskans and their communities. Efforts to reach out to the Community of Interest were successful in gathering input from over 1,800 Alaskans.

Respondent Demographics

Survey Two was comprised of two different sections. A total of 1,847 people contributed to the first section and 1,684 (91%) of those people also contributed to the second section. Completion of all questions within each section was optional and there were no limitations on the number of selections that could be made.

Respondents represented a variety of age groups, professions, and regions in Alaska.



- The majority of respondents were between the ages of 30 and 59 years old. Sixteen percent were age 60 or older, and 6% were age 20 or younger.
- Just over 60% of respondents identified one of the following five professional categories as their area of professional experience: Health Care Practitioner and Technical Support; Administration and Management; Education, Training, and Library; Public Health Professional; and Health Care Support
- The number of respondents in each region closely aligned with the population distribution in Alaska. See figure 3 (pg. 8) in the full report for more detail.

Key Findings

The results display two levels of detail provided by respondents: 1) general health areas selected as high priority, and 2) specific health indicators selected as candidates for the 25 LHIs.

Section One: Priority Health Areas

Of the 16 broad health areas that were presented, four were selected by more than 80% of respondents. These were (in order):

- Alcohol and drugs
- Nutrition and exercise
- Health care
- Abuse and violence

Respondents could select multiple health areas and all health areas were selected by at least 60% of respondents. See Table 1 in the main report for the full results displaying the general health areas selected as high priority (pg. 10).

Section Two: Health Indicator Selection

A total of 1,684 Alaskans responded to the second section of the survey, which asked respondents to select the indicators they felt should be included in the list of 25 Leading Health Indicators for Alaska. Respondents were allowed to select as many of the 71 health indicators as they desired. The list below displays the five most frequently selected indicators.

- Rate of deaths due to suicide
- Number of households with access to safe water and proper sewage disposal
- Percentage of adults age 18 and older who meet criteria for overweight and obese
- Percentage of high school students who felt so sad or hopeless every day for 2 weeks or more in a row that they stopped doing some usual activities in the past 12 months
- Percentage of high school students with three or more adults (other than their parent(s)) who they feel comfortable seeking help from

Results by Region

The results were relatively consistent across regions. Analyses of the regional results are provided in the Appendix.



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Community of Interest Survey Two Results

BACKGROUND

This report contains the findings from the Healthy Alaskans 2020 Community of Interest Survey Two, which was open for public input between January 15, 2013, and February 28, 2013. Survey Two was designed to collect addition information on general health areas of concern to individuals and their communities as well as information about the specific health indicators that are most meaningful to Alaskans and their communities. The survey was successful in gathering input from 1,847 Alaskans.

Healthy Alaskans 2020

Healthy Alaskans 2020 is a statewide initiative to identifying 25 Leading Health Indicators (LHIs), or measurements, to guide health efforts in Alaska for the remainder of the decade. The HA2020 initiative is a joint effort between the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services and the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium. The goals of the project are to: improve the quality of life for all Alaskans; achieve health equity; and promote healthy environments. The vision of HA2020 is healthy Alaskans in healthy communities, and the mission is to provide a framework and foster partnerships to optimize health for all Alaskans and their communities. The HA2020 goals and indicators belong to all Alaskans, and will require a shared responsibility and commitment from around the state to be successful in reaching the target measures for the 25 health indicators by 2020.

The HA2020 process will consist of identifying a short list of LHIs, setting targets for improvement between now and 2020, and highlighting relevant evidence-based strategies to help reach those targets. The LHIs will guide efforts in our state around common health goals to improve health outcomes for all Alaskans. Through collaboration across sectors, the process provides many opportunities to build trust and a foundation for shared responsibility and commitment to tackle identified health needs among partners and stakeholders. Community engagement is a vital component of efforts to improve the health of populations and communities, expand access to quality health services, prevent disease, and achieve health equity for all Alaskans. The process of establishing LHIs for Alaska must involve more than simply collecting and analyzing available quantitative data on factors that influence the health of both individuals and the community in which they live; it is also critically important to ensure that the LHI are in alignment with the concerns of the people of Alaska. To meet this objective, HA2020 conducted community opinion surveys to actively seek input from a broad Community of Interest (Col).

Community of Interest

The Community of Interest (CoI) is a general term being used in the Healthy Alaskans 2020 initiative to refer to people in Alaska who share a common interest in public health and promoting healthy communities. The CoI includes the general public, health care professionals, and others interested in providing their input to the initiative. The CoI has been engaged in the process through community opinion surveys, or Health Priorities surveys. The surveys provide an opportunity for all those who have interest, concern, or investment in health issues to participate in the HA2020 process and provide input on health priorities and health indicators that are important to them and their communities. CoI input from Survey One and Two, along with available health data and statistics, will be used to help inform the HA2020 Advisory Team of health needs and priorities throughout Alaska as they select 25 LHIs to recommend to the HA2020 Steering Team for final approval.

Community of Interest Survey Two Results

Survey One

The first survey, Community of Interest Survey One, was open to the public between September 17, 2012, and October 22, 2012. Survey One asked about general health priorities for individuals and their communities. Over 1,700 Alaskans responded to the first survey and shared their general health priorities and concerns, the highest of which were alcohol use; the cost of health care; and diet, exercise and obesity. The results from Survey One are available on the Healthy Alaskans 2020 website (*ha2020.alaska.gov*).

The information from Survey One, along with information from data and content experts statewide, was provided to the HA2020 Advisory Team and used to narrow the list of indicators to 71 Potential Leading Health Indicators (PLHIs). These indicators and their respective health areas shaped the content for Survey Two.

SURVEY TWO METHODOLOGY

Survey Tool

A survey was the primary tool used to gather input from the Community of Interest in Alaska. The survey was primarily web-based, but paper versions were available so as to make the survey accessible to all audiences. The 71 PLHIs selected by the Advisory Team served as the foundation for creating Survey Two. The survey contained two sections; the first and required section asked respondents to select their greatest health priorities from a list of 16 general health areas. Respondents were allowed to choose as many health areas as they wished. The second part of the survey gave respondents the opportunity to select the specific health indicators they felt should be included in the top 25 leading health indicators for Alaska; again, respondents were not given a limit to their selections. The content and format of the survey were developed and tested for readability among members of the general public.

Outreach

Survey Two was coordinated to be launched at the start of the Alaska Public Health Association's Health Summit on January 14, 2013. This event served as the initial form of outreach to help engage the Col and promote the launch of the survey. There were numerous other forms of outreach efforts carried out by others involved in the HA2020 project to help solicit survey input from the Col. These efforts included, but were not limited to, press releases, advertisements, interviews, presentations, and social media campaigns. At the close of the survey on February 28, 2013, a total of 1,847 people from all over the state provided input. These survey respondents represented a variety of age groups and professions in Alaska. Please see the respondent demographics section of this report for more information on survey respondents.

Analysis of the Results

Both sections of the survey were analyzed at the statewide and regional level using Microsoft Excel 2010 software. A rank was assigned to each health area and indicator based on the number of selections it received from respondents. The statewide results are presented in the main body of this report; regional results can be found in the appendix. Regional findings are grouped by the six labor market regions in Alaska as shown in Figure 3.




SURVEY FINDINGS

Respondent Demographics

Select demographic information was collected from respondents for the purpose of assessing representativeness of the results. The results are displayed below.

Figure 1. Survey Response Distribution by Age Group




Survey Response Distribution by Age Group

- The regional distribution of survey respondents was very similar to the actual population distribution.


Southeast

Section One: Priority Health Areas

Table 1 displays the results from the first section of the survey, which asked survey respondents to select the health areas that were of greatest concern to them and their community. Respondents were able to select as many health areas as they wanted.

- 1,847 people responded to this question.
- Every health area was selected by between 63% and 89% of survey respondents.
- The most frequently selected health areas were alcohol and drugs, nutrition and exercise, health care, and abuse and violence. The health area with the least number of selections was environmental health, which was identified as a priority health area by 63% of respondents.
- Respondents provided input based only on the name of the health area, without seeing the associated health indicators.



Section Two: Health Indicator Selection

Table 2 displays the results from the second section of the survey, which asked respondents to select the indicators that they believed would be most useful for them and their community to monitor health priorities in Alaska. The table is organized first by the results of the health area selection. Health areas are presented in the order of most to least number of selections. The indicator selection results are presented within their respective health areas.

- The indicator with the greatest number of selections was the rate of the deaths due to suicide, which belongs to the injury and suicide health area. This health area was ranked number nine out of 16 in the first section of the survey.
- Note: Survey respondents were not limited to a certain number of selections in either section of the survey. Also, their responses in the first section had no influence on the indicators presented to them in the second section. It was therefore possible for a health area to receive a high number of selections and subsequent rank, while the indicator or indicators within that health area to receive a much lower rank, or vice versa. For example, the health area ranked lowest (environmental health) has a single indicator, which was ranked second overall as a priority indicator. At the same time, a

health area that was one of the highest priorities (health care - ranked 3rd among health areas), did not have any indicators that ranked above twenty overall.

Table 3 displays the indicator selection results from the second section of the survey. These indicators are ranked from highest to lowest based on the number of selections they received from survey respondents. Respondents were able to select as many health indicators as they wanted.

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CONCLUSION

The two levels of information generated by Survey Two were the result of the survey being divided into two sections. The first section of the survey asked respondents to provide input on the general health areas they felt were important to them and their community. Respondents were able to select as many health areas as they wanted, which resulted in the percent of health area selections ranging from 63% to 89%. It is important to note that respondents did not know which indicators were under the health areas before they were asked to select the health areas. Environmental health was the health area that was selected the least among respondents as one of their priorities, at 63%, while alcohol and drugs was the health areas that were selected as priorities by the most respondents included: nutrition and exercise; health care; and abuse and violence. Of note, these areas correspond almost exactly with the priorities with the highest statewide average rating of concern from Survey One, namely: alcohol use; cost of health care; diet, exercise and obesity; other substance abuse; and abuse and violence.

The results from the second section of the survey offers more detailed information about the specific indicators that respondents would like to see in the 25 Leading Health Indicators for Alaska. The indicators were organized under the general health areas, but survey respondents were not limited to selecting indicators from the health areas they selected in the first part of the survey. Additionally, respondents were able to select as many indicators as they wanted. The top indicator, based on the number of responses, was the rate of deaths due to suicide. This indicator, part of the injury and suicide health area, was selected by 1,127 people, or approximately 67% of all survey respondents who completed the second portion of the survey.

In a few instances, the indicators under some health areas of concern did not get an overwhelming number of selections. Because the two portions of the survey did not limit the number of selections and were not connected, it was possible for a health area to receive a high priority rank, while an indicator(s) within that health area received a much lower-ranked selection, or vice versa. For example, health care was one of the general health areas of great concern (3rd overall); however, there were six indicators listed under health care and not one was selected enough to place it in the top 20 in the overall rank of the indicators. This could have happened for several reasons. One possibility is that selections for indicators within certain health areas were split among a relatively large number of indicators, increasing the likelihood that no one indicator would stand out. Although health care is an important topic to many Alaskans, there was not a general consensus about the best way to measure the issue.

Another interesting example is environmental health, which was the lowest ranked health area. Despite this, the single indicator for environmental health, an indicator of access to safe water and sewage in houses, was an overwhelming choice for survey respondents, and was ranked second overall on the list of indicators. These details are important to consider when reviewing these data.

- The top 10 indicators selected by respondents from the Anchorage/Mat-Su Region were nearly identical to those selected at the statewide level, with a couple of exceptions. The indicator, the rate of forcible rape, ranked #9 at the regional level and 15th statewide; and the indicator, the rate of alcohol-related deaths, ranked 11th at the regional level and 10th statewide.

- 228 people or 88% of respondents from the Gulf Coast Region answered this question.
- The number of selections for each indicator ranged from 32 to 146, with the rate of deaths due to suicide indicator from the injury and suicide health area being selected by 146 people, or 64% of respondents residing in the Gulf Coast Region.
- The top 10 indicators selected by respondents from the Gulf Coast Region were similar to those selected at the statewide level, with a couple of exceptions. The indicator, the percentage of the population age 12 or older who report having used an illicit drug in the past month, ranked 8th at the regional level and 18th statewide; and the indicator, the rate of alcohol-related deaths, ranked 22nd at the regional level and 10th statewide.

Major differences in the top ten indicators include: the indictor, the percentage of women who gave birth who report use of alcohol during pregnancy, was 7th at the regional level and 11th statewide; the indicator, the percentage of high school students who smoked cigarettes or cigars or used chewing tobacco, snuff, or dip in one or more of the past 30 days, was 9th at the regional level and 14th statewide; the indicator, the rate of chlamydia (sexually-transmitted infection), was 10th at the regional level and 28th statewide; the indicator, the percentage of adolescents who meet criteria for overweight or obese, was 16th at the regional level and 8th statewide; the indicator, the number of Alaska Office of Children's Services child maltreatment cases, was 27th at the regional level and 7th statewide.
