## OBJECTIVE:

Reduce the percentage of repeated substantiated child maltreatment within last 12 months.



## STRATEGY:

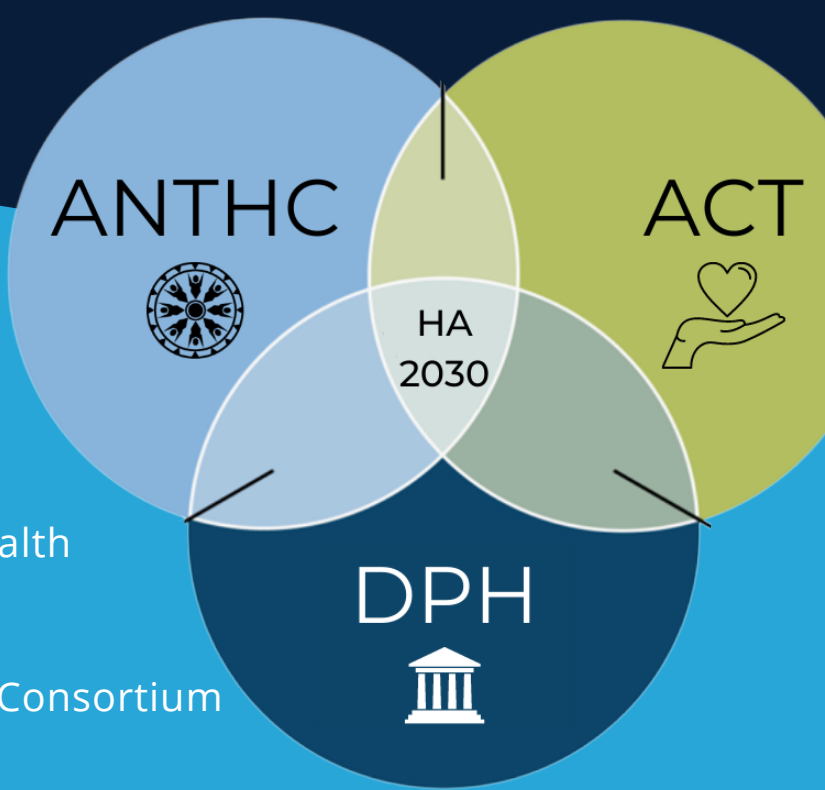
Decrease the rate of children that are uninsured in Alaska. With a rate of 9.4% total uninsured children and 10,000 eligible but unenrolled in Denali KidCare/CHIP, Alaska ranks third in the nation for highest rate of uninsured children (*American Community Survey, 2019*).



## ACTION:

Launch an outreach program in four primary Alaskan communities accounting for 72% of all uninsured children to notify families of the Denali KidCare/CHIP resource.
